The Tjungu Project camp is located on the Jingo family's homeland – an Indigenous Protected Area two hours' drive from Uluru. The essence of the program is to immerse a group of no more than 14 people with the family. Members of the family share their stories and the significance of the country around them and which they care for.



The visitors are well prepared by Mitch and his team so that they feel comfortable when they become part of life and culture of the Jingo family and are able to best comprehend what they experience, see and hear in this family setting so very different from their own. This allows the visitors to truly connect with the power of the culture and country around them by disconnecting from the distractions of a busy schedule, being in an incredible place, and meeting some amazing people.

The senior executive staff of major Australian companies have recently enjoyed a visit staying with the Jingo family, and testimonials from them and the family members have been compelling and encourage us to invite you to also experience this unique place and spend time with its extraordinary Traditional Owners.

Participating in a Tjungu Experience strengthens companies' reconciliation efforts and ESG priorities. It is also designed to support the development of your leaders and to strengthen your vision, values and strategies.
